F8F Bearcat

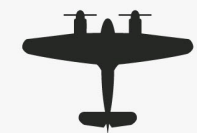
The Grumman F8F Bearcat was an American single-engine naval fighter aircraft of the 1940s.

Hawker Hurricane

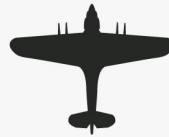
The Hawker Hurricane is a British single-seat fighter aircraft that was designed and built for the Royal Air Force.
